Momiji was grateful to be invited to take part in the Toronto NAJC's 30th Anniversary Redress Gala in November at the beautiful TIFF Bell Lightbox. The reception, chaired by Toronto NAJC Board member Lynn Deutscher Kobayashi, honoured the many individuals in Toronto and Hamilton who took an active role in the Redress campaign. Steps to achieve redress began in the forties with two legal challenges but the campaign for Redress came to fruition on September 22, 1988. This sold-out event was attended by over 250 people of all ages to mark this momentous occasion. Momiji's volunteers set up a beautiful Silent Auction and Sale which was well received by the guests and raised almost \$5,000.

At the Gala, the Toronto NAJC made a pledge to contribute \$60,000 over three years to our multi-year Momiji Community Wellness Fund Campaign. A cheque presentation took place in January where we were presented with the first instalment. We are thankful to the Toronto

NAJC for their continued support.

In January, we had the privilege of welcoming Mr. Fumiaki Miyamoto, the President of The Mitsui Canada Foundation to Momiji. At this time, Mr. Miyamoto presented Pam Waintraub, Chair of the Momiji Board and Eric Hong, Executive Director with a \$5,000 cheque. This brings Mitsui Canada Foundation's donation total to an incredible \$45,000 since 2011. Thank you for this annual support!

The Times They Are A Changing

Located in Scarborough, Momiji Health Care Society has always sought to support older Japanese Canadians everywhere. Momiji Seniors Housing residents have come from in and outside of Ontario. Momiji@Home has supported clients in Etobicoke, Downsview and elsewhere. Our congregate dining program is delivered in Don Mills and Mississauga. Our outreach worker goes to Hamilton to support Japanese residents at Macassa Lodge there. In 2018 Momiji celebrated its 40th anniversary and four decades of service to the Japanese Canadian community.

Following the 2018 Ontario election, the new government is seeking to re-structure health services-delivery. "Ontario Health Teams" being created to replace the Local Health Integration Networks represent a different way of administering health services that emphasizes geographically oriented care coordination and focuses on "local" populations. It will mean bundling together wide-ranging health service agencies. In Scarborough the local population is diverse; service providers have disparate clientele; service beneficiaries do not necessarily reside locally – e.g. Japanese clients of Momiji hailing from across the GTA. Time will tell how things will turn out under this new approach.

These are uncertain times for health care in Ontario and for Momiji. We will work with the provincial government, the City of Toronto, service partners and the community and engage all our stakeholders to chart the future path for Momiji. Caring for and supporting the well-being of older Japanese Canadians will continue to be our raison d'être.

Momiji's Seniors Active Living Centre (SALC) offers Momiji tenants and seniors living in the community numerous activities and services. While most of the programs are onsite at Momiji, there are some outings within the GTA. The program's objective is to reduce isolation, as well as promote and maintain health, well-being, safety and independence.

Some of the SALC programs offered only happen once a year however, most programs are offered weekly, bi-weekly or monthly. Momiji Club is a weekly program that gives participants a hands-on experience. Seniors meet every Tuesday from 10 am to 11:30 am in the SALC. Although there is a core group of just over 30 seniors, who are predominantly

female, we encourage and welcome new members.

If you love crafts, this is the program for you! In the past, birthday cards, origami art, seasonal ornaments, brooches and necklaces have been made. The finished product is either given out at the monthly Lug-a-Mug for the birthday celebrants or people take home the finished product. If you don't like crafts, some members play cards, do word puzzles or colour.

Yukie Beasley, our SALC Coordinator says, "I believe that meeting regularly each week and seeing familiar faces help seniors build a sense of belonging and comfort – just like a little family." 変遷する時代 所長の所感

スカーボロに所在するモミジ・ヘルスケア・ソサエティは日系シニア支援

に邁進しています。モミジ・シニアレジデンスには州外から入居される方もいます。モミジ@ホームは、エトビコーク、ダウンスビューをはじめ多くの地域の利用者を支援しています。会食プログラムは、ドンミルズとミシサウガで実施されていて、アウトリーチ・ワーカーはハミルトン市のマカサロッジの日系入居者を支援しに行きます。2018年にはモミジ創立と日系社会へのサービス開始40周年を迎え、祝いました。

2018年に州選挙で交代した政権はヘルスサービス改革を目指しています。「地域ヘルス統合ネットワーク」に代わり「オンタリオ・ヘルsteam」が発足し、ヘルスサービスの運営方法が変わり、地理的条件と地域住民に注目したケアの構想が示されています。そのためには、様々なヘルスサービス機関が一括されることとなります。スカーボロでは地域住民が多様化しており、サービス提供機関の利用者は必ずしも地域住民ではありません。例えば、モミジの日系利用者はGTA全域に居住しています。この新しい政策の影響を今後も見守りたいと思います。

今後、オンタリオ州のヘルスケアやモミジにとって不安定な時期が続くでしょう。モミジは州政府、トロント市、提携機関、コミュニティなどに働きかけ、モミジ関係者の方々と連結し、今後の進路を定めて行きたいと思えます。日系シニアの方々に敬意を払うことが私共の使命です。

寄付のニュース NAJCトロント支部 & カナダ三井物産基金

昨年11月、全カナダ日系人協会(NAJC) トロント支部主催リドレス(補償) 30周年記念祝賀会がTIFF Bell Lightboxで開かれモミジも招待されました。NAJCトロント支部理事会役員リン・ドイチャー・コバヤシ氏が委員長を務めたレセプションでは、リドレス運動で活躍したトロントやハミルトンの人々が称賛されました。二つの法的问题を抱えた補償への道は1940年代から始まり1988年9月22日に実を結びました。チケット完売の祝賀会では様々な年齢層の250名以上が出席し、この歴史的出来事を祝いました。モミジのボランティアはサイレントオークションを設置し、多くの方々の協力で5千ドル近くの収益を上げました。

Around the Building

Our Maintenance Team and Contractors have been very busy with a number of large scale projects.

Elevator Modernization:

The modernization of our three elevators which began in February 2018 was finally completed. During this time, the areas of deficiencies were also checked. The original elevator cabs remain the

same but all of the other operating components have been replaced.

Domestic Hot Water Pipe Replacement:

Since Momiji is over 25 years old, the domestic hot water pipes need to be replaced. This project will take a long time to complete since pipes and valves have to be replaced in each apartment by cutting walls and ceilings. The replacement cost of the hot water piping and

valves is estimated around \$600,000, which will be taken from the Reserve Fund. We will be ready to start this project in the fall.

Suite Saver Program:

Momiji has been approved by Toronto Hydro for the "Suite Saver" program which will allow us to replace all incandescent and CFL light bulbs with LEDs in all apartments for free. Installation began on May 8th.
