MORE THAN A GIFT – A LEGACY: THE UNITED CHURCH GIFT TO MOMIJI AND THE JCCC

On a day that was part reunion and full celebration, over 100 people gathered at Momiji Health Care Society (Momiji) to celebrate two generous donations from Toronto's Japanese United Church congregations to Momiji and the Japanese Canadian Cultural Centre (JCCC) on May 1.

In attendance were past and present ministers and congregants of the Toronto Japanese United Church (TJUC), Centennial Japanese United Church, Oriole-York Mills United Church, Bayview United Church, and Cummer Avenue United Church, as well as individuals from Momiji and the JCCC. During the formal presentation, representatives, and leaders from the church, Momiji, and the JCCC spoke of each institution's history and role in the Toronto Japanese Canadian community.

Each organization will receive a

donation of \$900,000 from the sale of the Bayview United Church (BUC) property and is a way to honour the legacy of Toronto's United Church congregants, past and present.

Over time, and with an aging congregation, it became more difficult to find new leaders to care for the building, so the BUC congregation came to the difficult decision to close in 2023. As part of the closing process, leadership searched for a church that could welcome BUC members into their congregation, finding Cummer Avenue United Church.

When a church is sold, the United Church of Canada encourages the congregation to find meaningful ways to continue its legacy, explained Rev. Cindy Cooper. Now retired, Rev. Cooper was the minister for the Toronto Japanese United Church, Oriole-York Mills United Church, and BUC for 20 years, first in the early 90s and then from 2006 to 2023.

"It was important for BUC to acknowledge its ongoing ministry

projects and especially its support of the Japanese Canadian organizations that were always an important part of its ministry. Hence, we are here today celebrating giving BUC legacy funds to Momiji Health Care Society and the Japanese Canadian Cultural Centre. These gifts that are given today, may they support and enrich your missions in the community," said Rev. Cooper.

A clear message throughout the event was that the donation is a testament to the Japanese congregations' perseverance, seen in their role in building a community for Japanese Canadians before, during, and after the war. During the war, churches operated in internment camps such as Lemon Creek and Kaslo. After the war, the Toronto United Church offered a space for community and connection to grow as Japanese Canadian members rebuilt their lives in new places.

BEHIND THE NUMBERS, BEYOND THE WALLS

It's been a long time since I have put pen to paper and written an article for Momiji Matters. To mark my return, I wanted to answer questions I get from the community in order to demystify some of Momiji's misunderstood truths.

Q: Why is there more than one Momiji corporation and what's the difference?

A: Momiji is comprised of two different corporations, Momiji Health Care Society (MHCS), and Momiji Seniors Residence (MSR). MHCS is the original entity, a charity to serve the general health care needs of Japanese Canadian seniors. Its primary source of funding is Ontario Health – Toronto (OH-T), which funnels money from the Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care (MOHLTC). For MHCS to be successful, we must meet targets set out by OH-T to continue to receive our funding. MSR came along second and its purpose was to focus on the housing of Japanese Canadian seniors. We receive funding from the MOHLTC's housing branch so that we can provide affordable housing and Rent Geared to Income (RGI) units. Up to 85 of our 133 units can be filled with residents who qualify for RGI, meaning they pay based on their annual income.

Q: Why does Momiji need to fundraise so much?

A: Financially, Momiji used to be in a place where fundraising would go to special projects like buying a new vehicle or new chairs for the auditorium, but unfortunately over the years, our funding has not increased as quickly as the costs. The reality is, to achieve the targets set out for us to get our Government funding, and to meet the needs of our seniors, Momiji has been forced to use fundraising to support operations.

Q: Should I give away my assets to get into Momiji faster?

A: No, absolutely not. It terrifies me how often I have received this question over the years. Momiji does have more RGI units than market, however, just reducing your annual income does not guarantee you will get into Momiji and could significantly harm your ability to live comfortably in your current situation.

Q: MSR has a lot of investments, why are they still asking for money?

A: This is a valid question I get quite often as well. MSR does in fact have two large investment portfolios, one for the residence portion of the building and one for the community centre. These are our capital reserve funds, which may seem like a lot of money, but realistically will get used up quite quickly as we begin to replace major systems and infrastructure that is now over 33 years old. We have already begun looking ahead 5, 10, even 25 years into the future, to see what the expected capital needs are for Momiji. ■

"When Japanese Canadians were stripped of their property, material possessions and dispersed, their community networks of support became a collective lifeline. Individual material success became less important than collective support, and the churches provided a critical connection that allowed the community to heal and to grow," said Chris Hope, volunteer President of the JCCC.

The JCCC and Momiji were fittingly chosen to receive these legacy gifts as both institutions exemplify that spirit of support, community, and legacy for Japanese Canadians in Toronto. The JCCC opened in 1963, after 75 Japanese Canadian families mortgaged their homes to build it, just 14 years after the internment ended. Today, the JCCC continues to promote understanding, inclusion, and friendship by sharing the Japanese Canadian experience and traditional and contemporary Japanese culture.

There are strong and long-lasting ties between Momiji and BUC, and many past and present BUC congregants have called Momiji home. Rev. Cooper ran monthly English worship services at Momiji for BUC congregants.

Like the JCCC, Momiji plays an important role in supporting the Toronto Japanese Canadian community. Established in 1978 by a group of JC leaders to support the aging Issei with programming, the building opened in

1992. Momiji's mission is to create an environment where seniors can thrive emotionally, physically, and culturally. With services like the Seniors Active Living Program, meals, friendly visits, transportation, and Momiji@Home, Momiji supports seniors across the GTA.

"[BUC]'s generous contribution will help us continue delivering these high-quality services. But more than that, it will allow us to grow—to expand what we offer, to innovate, and to respond to the changing needs of our aging population. In a time when home and community care are more essential than ever, your support lights the way forward," said Eugene Kam, Momiji's CEO. "This donation is more than a gift—it is a legacy. A legacy of care, faith in community, and a commitment to honour our seniors with respect and compassion. It will benefit not just today's seniors but generations to come."

The formal ceremony closed with the room singing the hymn *Our God Goes With Us*. Written in 2006 by David Kai, the hymn reflects a time of uncertainty for the congregation, which had just amalgamated with Centennial UC. Leaving their Dovercourt location, its home for 49 years, and heading into an unknown future, the hymn holds a special significance for the congregation, said Robert Kunihiro, Momiji Board of Directors Vice Chair, and lifelong member of TJUC.

The hymn ties in earlier chapters of Japanese Canadian history, including

the postwar migration of Issei and Nisei from B.C., the hardships faced, and the resilience of those who endured forced uprooting, dispossession, and internment.

The recent amalgamation doesn't mean the end of the congregations' connection to the Toronto Japanese Canadian community. The ministry has monthly services at Momiji and BUC brought important symbols to recognize its rich history, including the beautiful stained-glass dome designed by Moriyama from the Dovercourt Road church, which followed the congregation to the Bayview church, and now in its new home, is installed in the glass entrance at Cummer Avenue United Church. ■

ENTERTAINMENT, SOCIALIZING AND DESSERT – THE VIDEO SHOW PROJECT

In May of this year, the Elder's Council of TorontoNAJC offered a new, free social activity program for Momiji residents called the Video Show. The project's purpose is to provide entertainment by showing interesting videos to residents and providing an opportunity to socialize with fellow residents. Also, it filled a blank timeslot immediately after supper once a week. We worked with the staff of Momiji's Seniors Active Living Centre (SALC) to

shape the program to include a brief refreshment break including dessert to encourage socializing. Each edition consisted of two videos on Japanese life and places and one heartwarming video on pets and animals.

The trial demonstrated the Video Show Project to be a success over the eight weekly shows. Attendance by residents over the trial period averaged 29 and remained high indicating that the format and content of the Video Show held the interest of the residents. Also, feedback was very positive and seeing the residents talk amongst themselves and clearly enjoy

being together has been rewarding.

As a result of the successful trial period the Video Show Project was continued on a twice a month basis in July and August attracting the same number of residents. Also, TorontoNAJC has approved further funding for the project to continue twice a month in the Fall-Winter of this year. We are grateful for the strong support for the project by the SALC staff by providing space, printing, and refreshment supplies. The first show of the Fall-Winter session was held on September 4th. ■

MOMIJI SUMMER STUDENTS OF 2025 – EXPERIENCES

The Summer of 2025 started with the hiring of eight Summer Youth Workers funded by the Canada Jobs Program Grant 2025 (Government of Canada). This program encourages nonprofits and companies to provide working experience to young people during the summer. Momiji is just one of the nonprofits that benefited from this program, hiring Eliana, Ema, Keena, Leighana, Len, Natalie, Niko, and Sachi.

Eliana was the Client Services Administrative Assistant and worked with the Support Services Department. Her role involved a wide range of administrative tasks, including updating medical records and short visits to tenants' apartments. Eliana experienced a big shift in her perspective, in terms of the importance of healthy aging. With a supportive and culturally sensitive community, she learned that a person could live life to the fullest. She was especially surprised to see that many seniors in their 90s and 100s were so independent and thus learned to focus on a person's ability, rather than limitations.

Ema was one of two Community Services Assistants and worked with the Senior Active Living Centre (SALC). This was where she helped run and organize various events for the tenants, such as Bingo, Lug-a-Mug, Seated Exercise Classes, and Sing-Alongs. Ema was surprised to learn how interconnected everyone at Momiji was. She found out that one of her Japanese grade schoolteachers lived at Momiji.

Keena was the Volunteer Engagement Program Worker and worked with the Volunteer Management Department. She played an integral role in organizing the Volunteer Appreciation event and helped SALC at many of their events such as Lug-a-Mug. She also helped with Momiji's Bazaar and Yard Sale in various capacities including sales.

Leighana was the Community

Services Assistant and worked with the Community Services Department. Her role involved administrative tasks related to food services and transportation. Leighana was proud to play the violin at the July Lug-a-Mug and was honoured to share a Tenant's life story.

Len was the other Community Services Assistant and worked with SALC. He took attendance, prepared activities, and helped the tenants participate in activities. Being able to help the tenants at Momiji live fulfilling and independent lives has given him countless experiences that he will cherish and has made him look forward to growing older.

Natalie was the Marketing Assistant and worked in the Communications and Development Department. Her job was to design and create posters, social media posts, signs, and banners, and help with event photography. Natalie was proud to have worked on audio editing and transcribing the interviews for the Momiji Tea & Memories Podcast. She liked hearing and reading the stories from the Tenants.

Niko was the Client Intervention Assistant and worked in the Client Intervention Department. She organized the annual applicant survey and called applicants. Her other duties were to organize the IT Support Program, including managing the bookings and creating materials for

group sessions. Niko wanted to use her ability to speak Japanese at work to help seniors and chat with them. She said that she wants to live here since Momiji changed her perspective on community living!

Sachi was the Accounting Assistant and worked in the Accounting Department. His knowledge of Excel Spreadsheets was invaluable to the team, and his knowledge of cameras made him a sought-after volunteer at both Momiji's Bazaar and Yard Sale.

All the Students agreed they gained valuable work experience, formed new connections, and learned new things. Most of the Summer Students were able to reinforce their desire to pursue careers in the health care field (Medicine, Pediatric Field of Nursing, Psychology/Neuroscience), while Len learned the art of communication, and Natalie built a stronger graphic design portfolio.

The students offered this advice for future Summer Students:

- Take the initiative
- Step out of your comfort zone
- Chat and connect with the Tenants, staff, and volunteers
- Take every opportunity to learn
- Ask for help when you need it
- And bring some extra food just in case you get hungry!

BEHIND-THE-SCENES: MOMIJI TEA & MEMORIES PODCAST PROJECT

About a year ago, Brian Mahoney, one of Momiji’s key volunteers, pitched the idea of starting a Podcast to Momiji Staff. Brian had been assisting with Momiji’s Hearing Clinic and realized that some of the people sitting across from him, based on their ages, would have lived through significant times in history - what we can only read about in books, they lived through. So, because everyone has a story, some from many decades ago that will be lost unless we preserve them, the idea of the podcast began.

Fast forward to the Summer of 2025 and we are excited to announce that the Podcast Project has begun, thanks to Brian’s hard work, along with our Summer Students, and staff. This is an inside look at what exactly the “Podcast Project” is and what has been going on behind the scenes.

The first major promotion was during

the June Lug-a-Mug, while the Summer Students introduced themselves to the Momiji tenants. Informational posters were posted around Momiji to garner interest in the project itself.

The Summer Youth, Ema, Len, Sachi, Nico, Eliana, Keena, and Leighana, all took part in interviewing various tenants who wished to share their stories. Brian also took part in interviews.

The interviewers enjoyed listening to what the tenants had to say. Their stories held so much history from their perspective and from what they knew of the times. It was personal, emotional, inspirational... There was a journey made in their recounted tales of a section of their lives.

The goal was to create an archive of Momiji’s tenants’ histories, memories, and stories of their lives and what they lived through. It is an important history that cannot be lost in time. And the best way to do just that was

to create a podcast to share, archiving lived stories on the internet.

Natalie, another Summer Youth, took part in extracting the audio files from the recorders, manually transcribing the interview using “Dialogue Style”, and editing the audio.

The content for the videos is slowly coming together. As more interviews are done, and more interviewees come forward with stories to tell, the Momiji Podcast Project Team will have more to work with and will be able to preserve Momiji’s past for future generations. Or for anyone who is interested in hearing personal stories from the Momiji seniors.

LAUNCHING A NEW CAREGIVER SUPPORT GROUP

Since last year, our Client Intervention Team has been offering a six-week workshop called Powerful Tools for Caregivers. We've held it three times so far, and another session is coming this fall (online). Many people aren't sure what to expect from the workshop until they join. Common questions include: "Will they teach me how to be a more dedicated caregiver?" "Will there be homework?" or "Isn't six weeks too long?" Our answer is: No. This class is not about adding more pressure to your life.

Instead, this workshop focuses on you. For example, each week, you'll create a simple action plan with something small

that brings you joy, such as a few minutes of meditation, making a smoothie, or saying something kind to yourself. There's no pressure to be perfect. If you miss a goal, we'll talk about it together and find gentle ways to move forward.

Many of our past participants have shared that they didn't fully understand what the workshop was about at first, but by the end, they realized it was more about taking care of themselves, not just the person they care for. The six weeks often pass quickly, and by the final session, participants often form meaningful connections with their classmates. The sense of community becomes something they miss once the workshop ends.

To continue that support and connection, we're excited to announce a new bi-monthly caregiver support

group for workshop graduates. The first gathering took place in September, and we'll continue to meet on the third Thursday every other month. It will be a space to reconnect, share, and support one another. We hope this will become one of the powerful tools in their caregiving journey.

Our team values supporting caregivers through community, so they do not become isolated or feel they must sacrifice their own well-being. Even if you cannot join the Powerful Tools for Caregivers workshop, please do not hesitate to reach out when you are feeling overwhelmed or simply need someone to talk to. Our team and support group are always here for you, so you do not have to face it alone. ■

INTRODUCING THE FAMILY BEHIND THE NEW AIHOSHI-KATO ENDOWMENT FUND

Recently, one of Momiji's original residents decided to help the Momiji community by making a lasting difference. Rose Aihoshi and her family donated equities to set up the Aihoshi-Kato Endowment Fund, providing ongoing funding, approximately \$17,000 in 2025, to support a range of community-focused programs, events, activities, services and more.

Of the remaining original tenants, Rose, now 102, was one of the first to move in. An executive secretary, she and her late mechanic husband Tadashi had donated to Momiji since fundraising to build it began. She immediately began actively volunteering and continued doing so well into her nineties. Even now, she occasionally makes chow mein for the Momiji Cafe.

When Rose turned 100, the family initiated the popular Aihoshi Ice Cream Social to celebrate that occasion on an ongoing basis together with Momiji's residents. This event became the seed idea for the endowment, which will continue supporting the community in a variety of ways for many years to come. Momiji is already benefiting through a new defibrillation unit as well as a centrifuge for the nursing station. The Fund is also sponsoring a Coffee House each week and the annual tenant BBQ, with more to come.

Rose summed up her feelings and intentions by saying that "From the day it opened, Momiji has always had a very special feeling of community and engagement. I am extremely happy that our family can help to maintain this spirit by supporting activities, events, and services for both current and future residents."

Rose's daughter Gail is a dedicated long-term volunteer and a Board member, while son Richard also volunteers regularly. Both noted that there are numerous ways other residents and their families can support Momiji and its residents. They also emphasized

that any donation, no matter the amount, can provide critical support, not just for programs and social events, but also for activities and even physical areas within Momiji that don't receive government funding.

Gail and Richard further noted that buying gifts for seniors becomes increasingly difficult as they age because they already have virtually everything they need. Both encourage families of residents to consider donating to Momiji so their parents and loved ones can mark special occasions by enjoying them together with their friends. They also pointed out that even a modest one-time gift of \$50 can help sponsor a monthly birthday celebration, a coffee house session and more.

Any amount helps and is greatly appreciated. And by helping others, donors also elevate themselves, a sentiment that Rose Aihoshi clearly embodies. ■

トロントの合同教会 モミジとJCCCへ寄付

モミジ・ヘルス・ケア・ソサエティと日系文化会館 (JCCC) はトロントに所在する日系の合同教会から多大な寄付を受けました。その祝賀会が5月1日にモミジで開催され100人以上の関係者が集まり祝福と再会の時を過ごしました。

当日はモミジとJCCCの関係者をはじめ、トロント日系人合同教会、センテニアル日系人合同教会、オリオール=ヨークミルズ合同教会、ベイビュー合同教会、カマー・アベニュー合同教会の当初から今日まで関わった牧師と信者が出席。プレゼンテーションでは教会の指導者やモミジとJCCCの代表がそれぞれの歴史やトロントの日系社会における役割を述べました。

ベイビュー合同教会の所有地売却によるモミジとJCCCへの寄付、各\$900,000はトロントの合同教会の信者のレガシーに敬意を示すものです。

教会に集う人々の高齢化に伴い建物管理をする新しい指導者が見つからず、ベイビュー合同教会は2023年に教会の閉鎖をやむなく決定し、信者はカマー・アベニュー合同教会に迎えらるることになりました。

1990年代初期と2006~2023年の計20年間にトロント日系人合同教会、オリオール=ヨークミルズ合同教会、ベイビュー合同教会の牧師を務めたシンディ・クーパー牧師 (既に退職) によると、教会が売却された時にカナダ合同教会が「教会のレガシーを継続できるような意義のある方法を見つけるように」と勧めたそうです。

クーパー牧師は「ベイビュー合同教会は奉仕活動の継続と、その重要な一部であった日系団体への支援を認識し、レガシー基金をモミジ・ヘルス・ケア・ソサエティと日系文化会館に寄付することに決めた。今回の贈り物が両団体のコミュニティにおける使命を支援できるようにと願っている」と述べました。

今回の寄付を通して、日系信者の方々が戦前・戦中・戦後の日系社会構築において忍耐強く関わったことが明らか

に示されました。戦時中はレモンクリークとカスローの強制収容所に教会があり、戦後はトロント合同教会が日系社会に場所を提供し、それを基盤に新しい土地で生活を築く日系人の繋がりが広く築かれていきました。

JCCC会長のクリス・ホープ氏は「日系人が財産や所有物を奪われ分散させられた時に、コミュニティの支援網が集団的なライフラインになった。個人の物質的な成功よりも集団的な支援が重要だった。教会はコミュニティが癒やされ成長する上で極めて重要な連携を提供してくれた」と述べました。

JCCCとモミジは「トロントの日系団体として、支援・コミュニティ・レガシーの精神を有する」として今回の寄付に選ばれました。1963年に開設したJCCCの建築では75の家族が自分の家を抵当にしました。強制収容が終わってから僅か14年後のことです。今日、JCCCは日系カナダ人の経験及び伝統的・現代的な日本文化を広めながら相互理解・多様性の尊重・友好を推進しています。

クーパー牧師がモミジで暮らすベイビュー合同教会の信者に毎月の礼拝をおこなっていたことから、モミジとベイビュー合同教会の間には長きにわたる繋がりがあります。

モミジはJCCCと同様にトロントの日系社会の支援に重要な役割を果たしています。1978年、高齢化する日系一世の支援をすべく日系の有志らによってモミジが創立され、1992年に施設が開設。モミジはシニアの方々が精神的・身体的・文化的に健康な生活が送れる環境を作ることを使命として、シニア・アクティブ・リビングセンターのプログラムをはじめ、食事プログラム、フレンドリー訪問、送迎、モミジ@ホームなどを提供し、GTA (トロントと近郊) の広域でシニアの方々を支援しています。

モミジのユージン・カム最高運営責任者は「ベイビュー合同教会の多大な寄付はモミジの質の高いサービスの継続を支えるだけでなく、高齢化と共に変化するニーズに対応した刷新的なサービスの拡大を可能にする。地域や住宅でのケアがこれまで以上に必要とされる時に、同教会の支援はモミジの将来に明るい希望を与えてくれる。この寄付は単なる贈り物ではなくレガシーだと思う。それはシニアの方々のケア

をはじめ、コミュニティへの信頼や、シニアの方々への敬意が受け継がれることである。今回の寄付は今日だけでなく将来のシニアの方々にも恩恵をもたらす」と述べました。

最後に賛美歌Our God Goes With Usの歌唱で閉会。トロント日系人合同教会の長年の教会員でモミジ理事会副理事のロバート・クニヒロ氏は「この賛美歌は2006年にデイビッド・カイ氏が作詞したもので、49年間集い続けたドーバーコート合同教会がセンチアル合同教会と併合された当時の不安を反映していて、信者にとっては特別な意義がある」と述べました。

この賛美歌は日系カナダ人の歴史の初期の重要な一連の出来事にも繋がっています。戦後、B. C. 州から移動した一世・二世が直面した困難や、家族が引き離され、所有財産を奪われ、強制収容所へ移された経験に耐えた人々の逞しい回復の歌でもあります。

今回のような合同教会の併合があっても教会とトロント日系社会の繋がりは続きます。モミジでは牧師の礼拝が毎月、行われます。ドーバーコートの教会にあったモリヤマ氏設計のステンドグラス・ドームは、歴史の貴重な象徴としてベイビュー合同教会に移転され、今後はカマー・アベニュー合同教会の玄関に設置されます。

モミジについて 良くある質問に答えます

財務・運営部より、モミジについて多くの方が疑問に思われていることにお答えします。

Q: 「モミジ」は一つの組織ですか？

A: モミジは「モミジ・ヘルス・ケア・ソサエティ」と「モミジ・シニアレジデンス」という二つの組織から成り立っています。「モミジ・ヘルス・ケア・ソサエティ」は日系シニアの方々のヘルスケアのニーズに対応する慈善団体です。主な資金源はオンタリオ州保健・長期ケア省からの助成金で、オンタリオ・ヘルス・トロントを介して受けています。継続的な援助を受けるには設定された目標を達成し続ける必要があります。一方、「モミジ・シニアレジデンス」は日系シニアの方々の住居の運営をする組織です。保健・長期ケア省ハウジング部からの助成金を受けて運営しています。133戸の住居のうち最高85戸を「所得に基づいた家賃」の条件を満たす方々に貸しています。

Q: なぜ、モミジは多くのファンドレイジングを必要としますか？

A: 以前は、ファンドレイジングといえば新車購入やオーディトリウムの新椅子の購入といった特別な目的のためのものでした。残念ながら、何年も前からモミジの資金がコストに追いつかなくなっています。現在は、政府の資金援助の条件に設定された目標の達成や、シニアの方々のニーズへの対応のためにファンドレイジングを運営の支援活動として続ける必要があります。

Q: モミジに早く入居できるためには自分の財産を誰かに譲ったほうが良いですか？

A: いいえ。それは違います。確かに「所得に基づいた家賃」の住居数「市場に基づいた家賃」の住居数よりも多くありますが、あなたの年間所得を低くしてもモミジに確実に入居できるわけではありません。むしろ所得を

減らすと現在の生活に影響を及ぼす可能性があります。

Q: モミジ・シニアレジデンスには多くの投資があるのに、なぜ、寄付を募るのですか？

A: モミジ・シニアレジデンスには住居の建物とコミュニティセンターがあり、その資本準備資金として二つの大きな投資があります。多額のように思われますが、実際のところ、築33年の建物で主要なシステムや基盤の改修をすると瞬く間に資金が底をつきます。モミジは既に5年、10年、25年先の設備資金の必要性を予測しています。

100歳の誕生日を記念してローズさんの家族は、これからも居住者の方々と一緒に祝いたいという願いをこめて「アイホシ・アイスクリーム・ソーシャル」という今では人気のサービスを立ち上げました。さらに、コミュニティをこの先何年も支援したいという思いが遺贈へと発展しました。モミジは既にその恩恵を受けています。看護ステーションの新しいAED（除細動器）や

遠心分離機、コーヒーハウスのスポンサーや恒例の居住者BBQなど。他にも支援が始まります。

ローズさんは「モミジは開設したその日からコミュニティと人との繋がりの暖かさを常に感じさせてくれた。私の家族がその精神を引き継いで、現在と将来の居住者のためにアクティビティ、催し物、サービスを支援できるのは本当に嬉しい」と述べました。

ローズさんの娘のゲイルさんは長年モミジのボランティアをしていて現在は理事会役員です。息子のリチャードさんも定期的にボランティアをしています。二人は「他の居住者やその家族の方々も、様々な方法でモミジや居住者の支援ができる」として「たとえ小額の寄付でも、プログラムや催し物、アクティビティ、それに政府の助成金で支援されない建物整備に生かされる」と述べています。

さらに「シニアへの誕生プレゼントを選ぶのは既に必要な物が揃っているだけに難しい。居住者の家族の方々には、プレゼントを買う代わりにモミジへ寄付をして周りの友人と共に祝う選択を考えていただきたい。\$50の寄付で月例誕生会やコーヒーハウスのスポンサーになることもできる」と話しています。
